8TH ANNUAL 'MY TURN' ESSAY COMPETITION

Kaplan, Inc. and Newsweek announce the eighth annual "My Turn" Essay Competition. High school students get the opportunity to showcase their writing ability and compete for academic scholarships. The competition gives students a forum for expressing their point of view and, perhaps, a chance to meet the rising costs of college.

THE USA GROUP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Here, you must have an annual adjusted gross family income of \$30,000 or less. In 2000-2001, the program awarded scholarships worth between \$1,000 and \$2,000. The scholarships may be renewed annually if a minimum grade-point average of 2.5 is maintained. Applicants from all 50 states, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands are eligible for the program.
